

Honors Internships (GN HON 1080H) Honors Internship is a disciplined, self-directed project of academic study and enrichment under the direction and scrutiny of a regular MU faculty member in conjunction with an off campus internship. It is an opportunity to translate experiential opportunities, such as field work or internships, into academic experience and achievement. All work must result in a written product. The scope and length will be agreed upon by the student and sponsoring professor. A letter grade and credit of 1 to 3 hours is awarded by the sponsoring professor based on the quantity and quality of the work. The academic work is normally completed in one semester, although the professor may grant an extension, if deemed appropriate, under the guidelines of the University of Missouri. Some departments may choose to limit the number of credit hours, and grade solely on an S/U basis. (NOTE: Not all degree programs will accept 1080H toward graduation requirements. The student should consult an Honors College advisor or an advisor in their academic division.)

Independent Study: Service-Learning (GN HON 1090H) Independent Study is a disciplined, self-directed project of academic study and community service, under the direction and scrutiny of the Director of the Office of Service Learning. It is an opportunity to perform community service in the context of academic experience and achievement. All work must result in a written project. The scope and length will be agreed upon by the student and coordinator. A letter grade and credit of 1 to 3 hours is awarded by the coordinator based on the quantity and quality of the work. Independent Study is normally completed in one semester, although the coordinator may grant an extension, if deemed appropriate, under the guidelines of the University of Missouri. (NOTE: Not all degree programs will accept 1090H toward graduation requirements. The student should consult an Honors College advisor or an advisor in their academic division.)

Honors Problems (GN HON 2085H) Independent Study is a disciplined, self-directed project of academic study and enrichment under the direction and scrutiny of a regular MU faculty member appropriate to the student's particular field of interest. It is an opportunity to pursue study of a subject or topic in more depth than would normally be available in traditional course work. All work must result in a written product. The scope and length will be agreed upon by the student and sponsoring professor. A letter grade and credit of 1 to 3 hours is awarded by the sponsoring professor based on the quantity and quality of the work. An Independent Study is normally completed in one semester, although the professor may grant an extension, if deemed appropriate, under the guidelines of the University of Missouri. (NOTE: Not all degree programs will accept 2085H toward graduation requirements. The student should consult an Honors College advisor or an advisor in their academic division.)

Honors Preceptorship (GN HON 2950H) Honors Preceptorship 2950H is designed to provide honors-eligible students with sophomore or junior standing, opportunities to earn academic credit by participating in research conducted by an MU professor. This opportunity allows the students to participate in ongoing research and gain valuable experience in their chosen field of study. All work must result in a written product. The scope and length will be agreed upon by the student and sponsoring professor. Credit of 1 to 3 hours is pre-determined by the sponsoring professor based on the quantity and complexity of the research work the student will be expected to do. A letter grade (A/F) will be awarded based on the evaluation of the student's work. (NOTE: Not all degree programs will accept 2950H toward graduation requirements. The student should consult an Honors College advisor or an advisor in their academic division.)

Honors Preceptorship (GN HON 4950H) Honors Preceptorship 4950H is designed to provide honors-eligible students with senior standing opportunities to earn academic credit by participating in research conducted by an MU professor. This opportunity allows the students to participate in ongoing research and gain valuable experience in their chosen field of study. All work must result in a written product. The scope and length will be agreed upon by the student and sponsoring professor. Credit of 1 to 3 hours is pre-determined by the sponsoring professor based on the quantity and complexity of the research work the student will be expected to do. A letter grade (A/F) will be awarded based on the evaluation of the student's work. (NOTE: Not all degree programs will accept 4950H toward graduation requirements. The student should consult an Honors College advisor or an advisor in their academic division.)
